

## FATA Annual Meeting Minutes 8/29/17 Hyatt Regency Grand Cypress Orlando, FL

- Welcome/Introduction of Board
- Year in Review
  - 5 meetings held this year between regional meetings and meeting at FOIL and FAMIS
- We would like to consider changing "Florida Association of <u>Test</u>
  <u>Administrators</u>" to "Florida Association of <u>Testing and Accountability</u>".
- Renaissance Learning sponsored Ron LaFace, Jr., Esq. who spoke on Florida Politics and Elections and Legislative Advocacy. He is a lobbyist with Capitol Consulting. Assessment is a hot button topic in Tallahassee and continues to be discussed but nothing is really changing.
  - Two Branches
    - Executive
      - State Board of Education is controlled by the Governor who is part of the Executive branch
      - Governor seat is going to be up for re-election
    - Legislative
      - 160 members (senate and house), mainly republican at this time
      - Terms are up every two years and there is a maximum of 8 years to hold a seat
      - Things can possibly change every two years
  - Elections
    - Very expensive, lots of money is needed because there are so many media markets
    - Florida law allows you to raise money in almost any form
    - Candidates are very aggressive with raising money
  - Political Funding
    - FEA—contribute to democratic candidates and those candidates lose

 Charter Schools and their management companies contribute to republican candidates and they win

## o HB 7069

- Made up of many different education issues (23-25)
- Assessment Issues
  - Publish tests by 2021, however this would cost the state a lot more money with the vendor so it most likely won't happen
  - Senator Montford put bill 964 together to address assessment issues, however the bill didn't go anywhere because Montford is a democrat so some of the things in the bill got put in 7069
  - Districts are challenging 7069 but not sure if it they will be successful
  - Legislative Platform for 2018 Session being developed by school districts
    - Paper tests expanding to grades 7-10
  - How do we make change as an association?
    - Build relationships with the aids
    - Research issues
    - Know your legislator
    - Put your issues on a one-pager, short and concise
    - Give pros and cons to each issue
    - Build supporters/coalitions (business groups, parents,
    - Go to delegation members and develop a relationship so they look at you as a resource and can call you for questions that come up
    - Never bluff an answer, if you don't know the answer tell them you'll get back to them
    - Always be ready to modify your position and negotiate
    - Spend time with legislators/aids when session isn't in and they have time to listen to you
    - Begin with focusing on people on the education committee

- Identify who they are and see if anyone has a relationship with them—if not, assign people to start building a relationship
- To be successful in lobbying be engaged, be credible, know what's going on
- Look at your district's legislative platform and voice your opinion
- Instructional Materials Association is relied upon as a valid and reliable source for FADDS, we need to become that for assessment.
- Curriculum Associates sponsored Lloyd Jones, Executive National Director, who spoke on Why Less is More: Reduce Redundant and Unnecessary Assessments
  - Interactive discussion on assessments:
    - What is the purpose?
    - How should they be used?
    - What do you do with the data?
    - How should test security be handled?

- Treasurer's Report (Cyndy)
  - o \$1,080.00 collected today/some registration fees are still in the mail
  - o \$2,000.00 left from last year
  - Paid for room today
  - o Bought a vase and flowers for Victoria's retirement
- Open Discussion
  - Paper Test Administration
    - After debrief Vince and Susie were going to begin their work on putting the item types to paper.
    - Concerns:

- Harder to track students that test on paper and move within or across districts
- Logistics is going to be awful
  - Storage
  - Manpower to deliver
  - Collection Process
- Additional cost to districts
- Will item types change/listening portion/how do you put performance items on paper
- Accommodations are easier with CBT
  - Text to Speech on the computer meets the students' needs better than a human reader, not to mention it takes more people to give this accommodation
  - Large Print is available on the computer, now students will have to go back to using large books that are cumbersome for students to handle
  - Computer knows what can and can't be read to students, humans make mistakes, perhaps they could at least identify what can be read with some kind of symbol or icon
- Survey districts to see how close they are to one-to-one since one of the arguments is that testing on paper can be done quicker
- Why can't we give two sessions in one day for EOCs if we can do it during the summer administration
- We should be able to give the writing and reading at the same time,
  it is too hard to track when we have them in two different windows
- Expense of purchasing calculators, now the calculator is available in the platform
- Scheduling
  - Difficulty of getting seniors tested
  - Shorter window gives less opportunity for makeups
- Paula introduced Susie Lee, Bureau Chief of K-12 Assessment and Jenny Black, Director of Test Administration from DOE
  - FLE IDs for adult testers and private school students
    - Shawna Reid at DOE is working on this

- Students can't just walk in to test anymore
- Concordant Scores
  - Vince will speak about this tomorrow
  - New workshop date will be announced
  - Math is being reconsidered, what was stated in the original webinar still stands regarding PERT
  - They would like to have new concordant scores this school year but a date has not been determined—we suggested that it be implemented next school year
- Out of State Algebra 1 Tests
  - List from Helen Lancashire is no longer being updated or valid
  - You must now look at the state the student is coming from and see what their state test is and if the student passed it or not
  - If an ESE student took and failed the Alg. 1 test from another state can we waive it—Susie is going to look into it with the ESE office
- How will the listening portion of ELA be conducted on paper next year?
  - DOE is still working on it, they will let us know as soon as they can what it is going to look like, it might involve each student having a tablet, however that would cost districts a lot of money
- Can we have an icon or symbol on the paper test that shows what can be read?
  - It would need to be on all paper tests, they won't be able to have "accommodated" tests
- What are the paper test items going to look like?
  - You can look at the accommodated paper practice tests to see the comparison
- Has there been any study to show the comparison of CBT versus paper?
  - No
- Will there be the same amount of extended response on the paper tests?

- There will be no hand scoring of paper tests so responses have to be scannable (bubbling)
- Will there be a process to match the scores on the paper test to the computer test?
  - We can ask Vince tomorrow
- Is there any way to give both sessions in one day?
  - No, that has not been discussed
  - Summer is different because that administration isn't calibrated like spring
- With paper, can we go back to giving session 2 before 1 for makeup reasons?
  - It can be considered
- Will schools be allowed more than one week to prepare the tests?
  - It is a possibility that can be looked at
- Is there a way to track if a student took a paper test in another school or district?
  - DOE is working with DRC so once a test is scanned they can track it (writing)
  - There isn't any way to track it within an administration window, you have to rely on the other district working with you
